DEFINITION:use superior strength or influence to intimidate (someone), typically to force them to do something


81% of Spanish adolescents admits he is concerned about the problem of bullying, according to data from INE at 2011

INMIGRATION

- DEFINITION: Immigration is the movement of people into a destination country to which they are not native or do not possess its citizenship in order to settle or reside there, or to take-up employment as a migrant worker or temporarily as a foreign worker.
- Immigration in Spain is from the 1990s, a phenomenon of great demographic and economic importance.
 According to INE, in 2011
 6.7 million pople were born out of their country.

- DEFINITION: A prejudice is an idea, stereotype or opinion formed reconceived way, that is, we attribute qualities to someone without prior information this person
